IdeaSpark Program

A collaboration between The Viscardi Center and the Hynes Institute of Entrepreneurship & Innovation at Iona University The IdeaSpark Program engages individuals with disabilities in developing an entrepreneurial mindset. Participants will explore what it takes to be an innovator and entrepreneur, by engaging in a series of activities that will let them identify an entrepreneurial opportunity and develop a feasible business idea over a six-week period.

Embedded in the virtual program will be opportunities for participants to interact with entrepreneurs and experts in their fields, as well as partner with Iona University students serving as Peer Mentors. Participants will be given challenges that will help them develop and apply entrepreneurial skills in action. At a culminating Pitchfest event, they will practice presentation skills and share aspects of their personal learning experiences, while pitching their business ideas and competing for equity-free cash grants.

Program Goals

The IdeaSpark Program is a collaboration between The Viscardi Center (TVC) and the Hynes Institute of Entrepreneurship & Innovation at Iona University. With historic commitments to advancing entrepreneurship, these two institutions are partnering to advance inclusivity among budding entrepreneurs in the disability community. Leveraging their unique strengths, TVC and Iona University are introducing this program to provide a fully accessible introduction to entrepreneurship as a first step for those interested in business ownership as a viable employment pathway to financial independence.

Program Benefits

Students in this program will:

- + Foster and apply an entrepreneurial mindset
- + Develop an idea into a viable business model
- + Enhance their presentation and pitching skills
- + Learn and apply creative problem-solving skills
- + Create a professional network with like-minded individuals
- + Pitch to a panel of judges for a chance to win an equity-free cash grant

Calendar & Platform

Program sessions will be conducted on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 11 am to 1 pm ET from June 6 through July 20, 2023. There will be no classes on July 4th or 6th.

Sessions will be conducted remotely via Zoom®. The Pitchfest event will be conducted on the Iona University campus in New Rochelle, New York for participants and guests who can attend in person. Others may participate and attend virtually.

In keeping with both partners' commitment to inclusivity, they will ensure a fully accessible learning environment including real-time captioning during classes and accessible digital material, i.e., PDFs, PowerPoints, videos. TVC will provide support to participants needing assistive technology and work with lona's faculty and staff to ensure coursework is fully accessible through the Litmos® Learning Management System. Prior to the start of the program, training on the use of Litmos® will be provided.

Eligibility

Participants must meet the following eligibility criteria:



Be 18 years of age or older and self-identify as having a disability



Have a business idea, or are actively launching a business



Commit to attend all class sessions and complete assignments



Sign the participant agreement*

Participants are expected to have a computer that can access web-based applications as classes will be offered on Zoom® and materials will be posted on Litmos®, a web-based learning management system. The Viscardi Center will ensure materials are digitally accessible and support participants' assistive technology needs to the extent possible.
